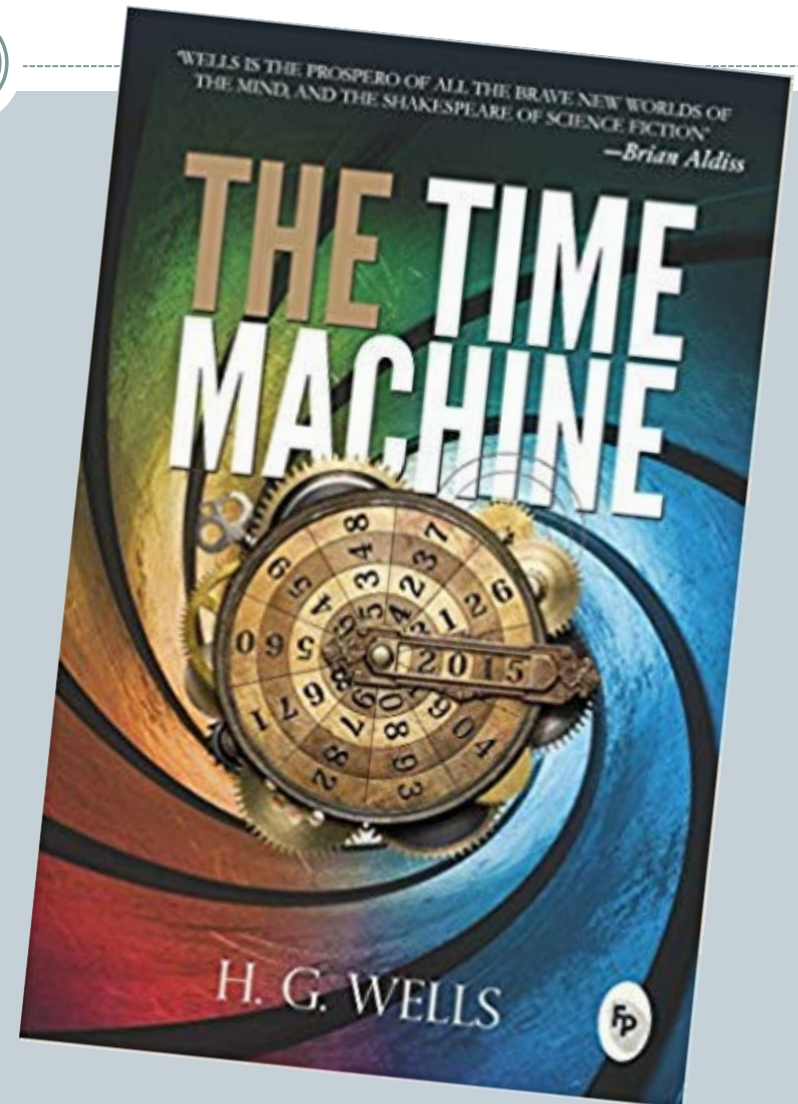

City Recorder's Office Ordinance No. 3526



ORDINANCE NO. 3526

SECTION 1. Chapter 9.04, entitled *Secondhand Property Dealers* is hereby added to the Roseburg Municipal Code to read as follows:

CHAPTER 9.04 - SECONDHAND PROPERTY DEALERS

9.04.005 Definitions. For the purpose of this Chapter, the following words and phrases are defined as follows:

"Peace officer" means a law enforcement official as defined in Oregon Revised Statutes 133.005.

"Personal identification" means an identification card or document issued by a recognized governmental agency which bears the full name, signature, photograph, date of birth, and physical description of the issued person.

"Non-valuable metals" are limited to metals not regulated by state law, such as dental gold, unrefined metal ore, gold or silver coins, or bullion in any form.

Fire Fighters CARE Donate Blood

A 16k volunteer in our family. I am a second generation Fire Fighter. I have been a professional Oregon Fire Fighter for the last 35 years. February 3rd, 2018 our oldest daughter went to the urgent care in Bend with what seemed like a cold and fever. She was also 20 weeks pregnant with our first grandchild. Our daughter's boyfriend called us at about 2AM in the morning to let us know that they were 20k so she had some type of infection. We were going to the local medical center and had to leave her with our 10 year old son. She was groggy but he loved to take care of her. We were going to the hospital but our ambulance for OHG 119 is in the morning. When we arrived at OHG 119 ICU of Roseburg, they looked normal. By midday, her condition had worsened. The Doctors told us they were doing everything they could but did not tell us she would make it much longer. Her main concern, he said and had about 100 Fluorimetric. She said had been treated with blood packing under her skin everywhere, her organs and even the surface of her eyes. She had bleeding in her brain and her kidneys were overworked. Along with constant blood transfusions, she needed to get most daily she were not on for almost a week of the hospital stay. After that success in the ICU they began monitoring the baby. Somehow, with everything she had gone through, the baby was not harmed. She stayed in the ICU total of six weeks and another month at the Cancer Center. During this time, we required our 4th blood transfusion and almost a month of products. To put it into perspective, 48 units is equal to 5 gallons of blood. April 11th, 2018 our first grandchild, James was born and Mariah was released from the Hospital.

The bottom line, you are never done as a parent. I have been giving assistance to the population as my fulltime job. It is now time that I give back to the community without reward. I started giving blood in August 2007 prior to our daughter's plight and been giving blood and blood products since then, as soon as I am able. Please give blood, I was amazed at the amount of blood and blood products our daughter went through. Talking to the OHG 119 staff, they get someone with Leukemia nearly once a week and they require a large amount of blood products for the chance to survive.

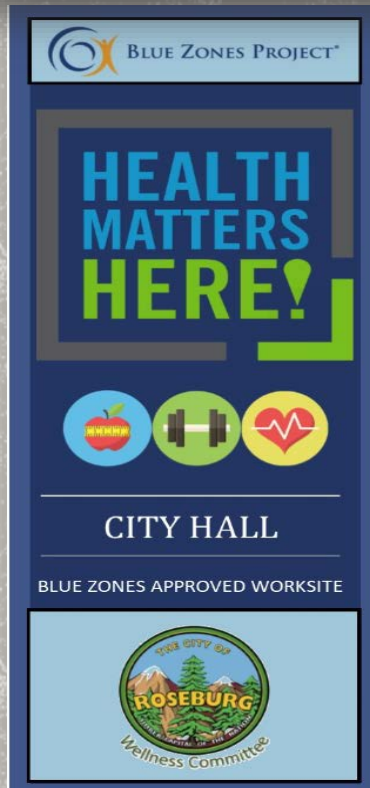

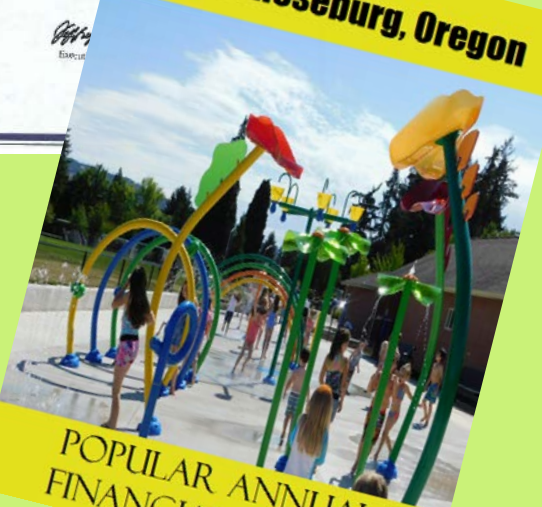

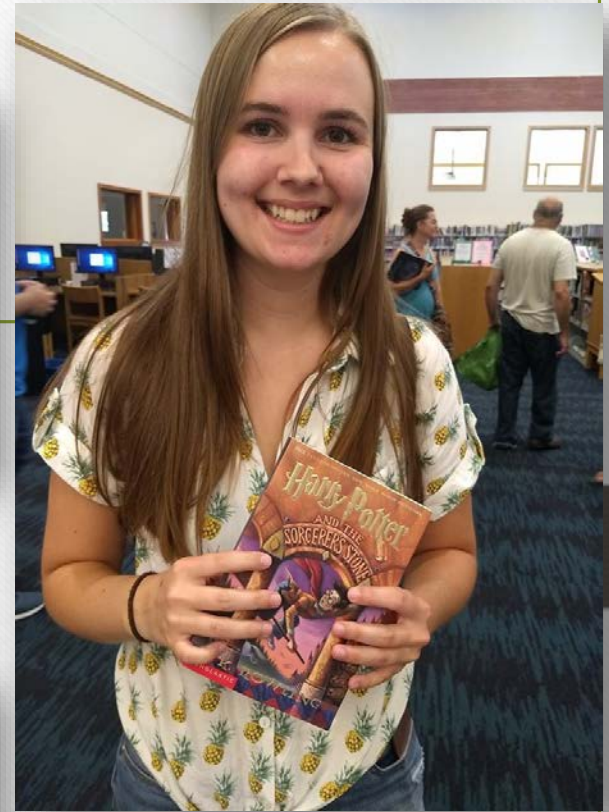

Downed utility lines, power company blackouts, heavy snow falls or summer storms can all lead to power outages. Many people turn to a portable generator for a temporary solution without knowing the risks.

- » Generators should be used in well ventilated locations outside away from all doors, windows and vent openings.
- » Never use a generator in an attached garage, even with the door open.
- » Place generators so that exhaust fumes can't enter the home through windows, doors or other openings in the building.
- » Make sure to install carbon monoxide (CO) alarms in your home. Follow manufacturer's instructions for correct placement and mounting height.
- » Turn off generators and let them cool down before refueling. Never refuel a generator while it is hot.



- » Store fuel for the generator in a container that is intended for the purpose and is correctly labeled as such. Store the containers outside of living areas.

Just Remember...

When plugging in appliances, make sure they are plugged directly into the generator or a heavy duty outdoor-rated extension cord. The cords should be checked for cuts, tears and that the plug has all three prongs, especially a grounding pin.

If you must connect the generator to the house wiring to power appliances, have a qualified electrician install a properly rated transfer switch in accordance with the National Electrical Code® (NEC) and all applicable state and local electrical codes.

FACT

- ! CO deaths associated with generators have spiked in recent years as generator sales have risen.

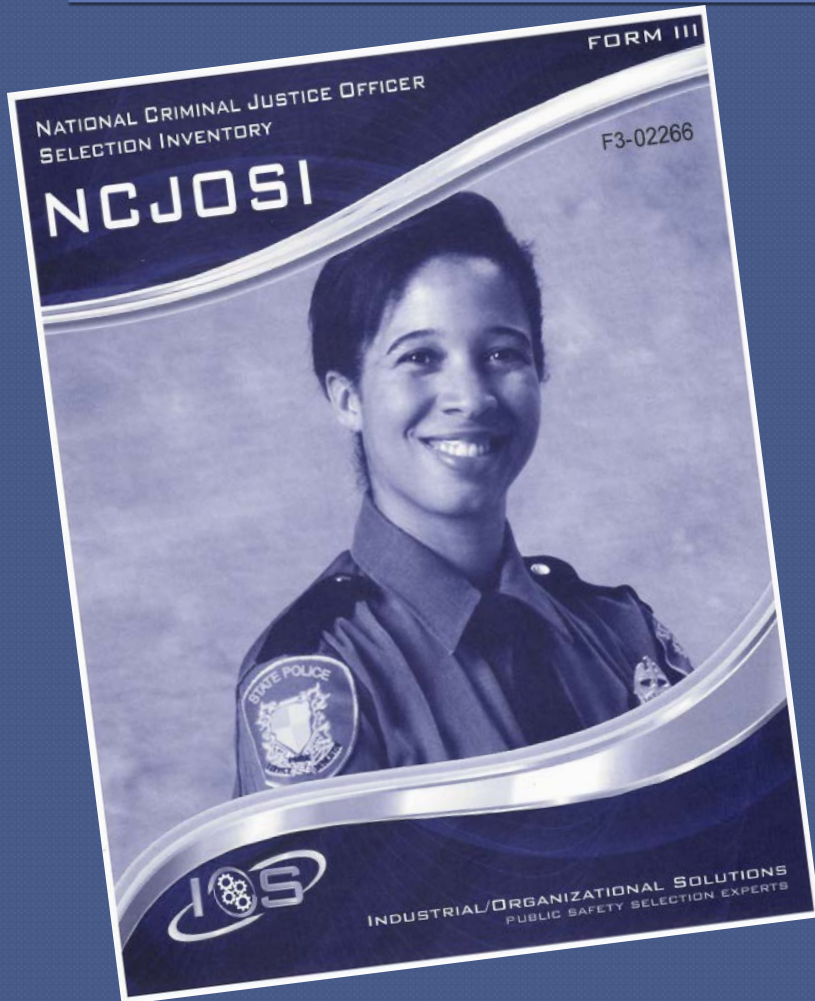

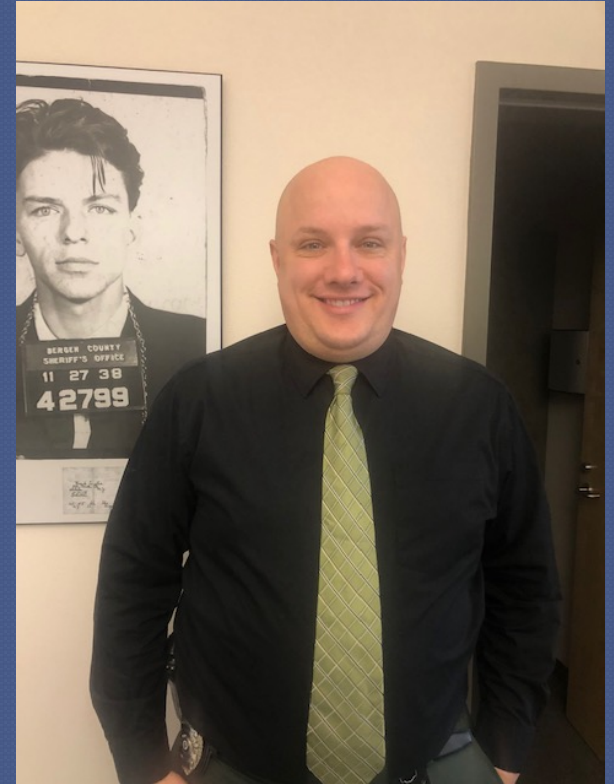

Mobile Crisis program is funded by a three-year, \$750,000 federal Bureau of Justice Assistance (BJA) grant



The grant is part of the BJA's Justice and Mental Health Collaboration Program



It is a joint project of the City of Roseburg and Compass Behavioral Health

Mobile Crisis is intended as an intervention to divert individuals with mental illness away from the Jail and the Emergency Department and into services when appropriate

THE PROBLEM

- Nationwide, people with serious mental illness are booked into local Jails about 2 million times each year (many also cycle through the Emergency Room).
- Three-quarters of these individuals also have drug/alcohol use problems.
- These individuals tend to stay longer in Jail than those without mental illness, and are at higher risk of returning to Jail upon release.
- Jails spend 2-3 times more money on adults with mental illness than those without.
- Thirty-six percent of people booked into the Douglas County Jail during a one-month period in 2018 were flagged as possibly having a mental illness.

Mobile Crisis Team

THE PROBLEM (CONT.)

- Douglas County 2018 population 110,000 +/-
 - Compass identified 8300 residents with a mental health diagnosis. *This did not include those with other service providers or the uninsured.*
 - Douglas County has 1 mental health provider for every 390 people, versus an average of 1 for every 230 people statewide.
 - 160 provider shortfall
