CITY OF ROSEBURG LIBRARY COMMISSION MEETING MINUTES July 18, 2023

CALL TO ORDER:

Chair Zielinski called the regular meeting of the Roseburg Library Commission to order at 4:00 p.m. on July 18, 2023, in the Ford Room at Roseburg Public Library, 1409 NE Diamond Lake Blvd., Ste. 100, Roseburg, Oregon and electronically via Zoom.

APPROVAL OF MINUTES:

Commissioner Guyer moved to approve the June 20, 2023, minutes. The motion was seconded by Commissioner Lundy and approved with the following vote: Chair Zielinski and Commissioners Guyer, Lindell, Lundy, Rutter, and Tassano, voted yes. No one voted no.

BUSINESS FROM THE COMMISSION:

Commissioner Tassano reported the Friends of the Library provided a check to the library for \$1466 from book sales. The Friends of the Library summer book sale was scheduled for August 31 – September 2 and would be a bargain book sale.

Director Wiley thanked the Friends of the Library for their ongoing support. Donations from the Friends were split between youth and adult programming and supported a number of items from presentation speakers, craft kits supplies, Summer Reading Program prizes, and more.

INFORMATIONAL:

Monthly Statistics

Director Wiley presented the monthly statistics. She reported that circulation in June was the highest in the library's history with 10,258 checkouts (74 percent physical items, 26 percent digital items). The previous record was 10,114 (96 percent physical items, 4 percent digital items) in January 2019. 62.8 percent of circulation was youth books.

The library issued 193 new cards last month, the most since January 2020 (229).

Programming numbers reflected the popularity of the Summer Reading Program and the library's outreach efforts. Nearly 1,500 craft kits were distributed last month.

Summer Reading Program

Director Wiley reported the Summer Reading Program continued through August 26. Adults were participating in the weekly bonus survey, and a couple of readers already submitted their first log, which meant they read 30 books since June 1.

Librarian Ropp reported the Youth Summer Reading Program was seeing a lot of involvement. 264 reading logs had already been submitted. Staff continued to follow the Roseburg School District Lunchbox Express and have reported increased involvement. Outreach continued at the Boys and Girls Club and Sunshine Apartments. Upcoming events include Harry Potter Day on July 29, Friday activities in the park, StoryWalk® at Beulah Park, and Wednesday Storytime at Stewart Park.

Staffing Update

Director Wiley reported Christian Sala would join the library team as the Resource Assistance for Rural Environments (RARE) member for the 2023-24 service term. Sala received a bachelor's degree in economics with a minor in art history from Rutgers University-New Brunswick. He has worked at the City of Eugene as a Recreation Coordinator for the past two years.

Grants Update

Director Wiley reported the library would apply for the annual Ready to Read grant from the State Library of Oregon to fund staff for the 2024 Summer Reading Program. The application was due August 31.

The library planned to apply by October to the American Library Association to host a traveling exhibit titled "Americans and the Holocaust." If successful, the library would use the Deer Creek Room for the exhibit for about six weeks and would be responsible for hosting four events in conjunction with the exhibit.

The library was closing out grants from The Ford Family Foundation for the storefront doors and the Roundhouse Foundation for the Summer Reading Program.

Other

Director Wiley reported the State Legislature approved statewide implementation of Dolly Parton's Imagination Library.

ADJOURNMENT:

The meeting adjourned at 4:20 p.m. The next meeting is scheduled for Tuesday, August 15, 2023, at 4:00 p.m.






The following is the discussion item on your agenda:


A. Amending Fee Schedule – The library proposes adding a fee of \$150 to cover the cost of re-keying locks when a renter of the Ford Room loses the key. The Ford Room is available for rent to community members when the building is not staffed by library or Douglas Education Service District personnel. One key is given to the renter, and it provides access to the front door, the Ford Room and two restrooms located in the lobby. Based on a verbal quote from a local locksmith, \$150 will cover the vendor's costs.

SUGGESTED MOTION – I move that the Library Commission recommend the City Council adopt a resolution amending the Fee Schedule to include the cost of re-keying locks associated with renting the Ford Room.
