LIBRARY COMMISSION MEETING MINUTES
December 16, 2025**

1. CALL TO ORDER

Chair Williams called the regular meeting of the Roseburg Library Commission to order at 4:00 p.m. on December 16, 2025, at the Roseburg Public Library, 1409 NE Diamond Lake Blvd., Ste. 100, Roseburg, Oregon and electronically via Zoom.

2. ROLL CALL

3. APPROVAL OF MINUTES

Commissioner Tassano moved to approve the November 18, 2025, minutes. The motion was seconded by Commissioner Bentley and approved with the following vote: Commissioners Bentley, Elder, Guyer, Lindell, Tassano, and Williams voted yes. No Commissioners voted no. The motion passed unanimously.

4. AUDIENCE PARTICIPATION

None.

5. BUSINESS FROM THE COMMISSION

Commissioner Tassano reported the Friends of the Library book sale on December 4th – 6th was very successful, made more than \$5000, received \$165 in donations to Dolly Parton's Imagination Library, and leftover books are on sale for 50 cents.

7. INFORMATIONAL

A. Monthly Statistics

Director Wiley reported the monthly statistics were on par with other Novembers in which we are closed for three days over Thanksgiving. As noted in November, there was a decrease in the number of books added in October because of

vendor issues. That led to an influx of 522 books added in November. There was a new chart related to digital newspaper use. Director Wiley asked the State Library of Oregon for direction on which data point to use in the annual report. New charts related to digital circulation by format and genre indicated digital audiobooks and adult fiction are most popular with Roseburg patrons.

B. Programming

Director Wiley reported the Winter Reading Program continues through December 31. Readers of all ages are invited to submit reviews of books they read this month for a chance to win one of several prizes. The program is sponsored by the Friends of the Roseburg Public Library.

Director Wiley reported she was pleased with the technology that accommodated the hybrid birding program co-sponsored by the Umpqua Valley Audubon Society. In January, the library will help the Parks Department with their semi-annual puzzle program. The library will partner with OSU Extension on January 8 for a cooking class for adults with developmental and intellectual disabilities; registration is required because there is limited seating. The library co-sponsors a hybrid program with the Audubon Society on January 28 about great horned owls.

Librarian Ropp reported that all of the kids' prizes for the Winter Reading Program are literacy themed. We had one baby at storytime today, and that was fun. Green preschool toured the library last week, and Winchester preschool is scheduled to visit next week. Elementary Book Club is going well. STEAM activities are scheduled later in the evenings each month, and they will be making a light-up holiday card this month.

Commissioner comments included appreciation for the improvements in audio-visual quality.

Director Wiley and Librarian Ropp clarified that spring sessions will continue through mid-April, youth programming pauses before the annual conference for librarians scheduled for April 22nd – 24th and restarts in June.

C. Strategic Plan Update

Director Wiley reported 353 people responded to the community survey. Strategic plan committee members are conducting interviews and focus groups over the next few weeks. We are on track to present the draft plan to the Library Commission in February.

Commissioner comments included that feedback from the public included surprise at how much the library has to offer and that membership is \$60 annually.

D. Grants Update

Director Wiley reported the library submitted a \$3000 application to the State Library of Oregon for Spanish language and large print materials and a \$20,000 application to the American Library Association to continue programming with adults with developmental and intellectual disabilities and purchase large print materials. The library has prepared and/or submitted final reports to the Douglas County Cultural Coalition for Summer Reading Program funds, The Ford Family Foundation for early literacy support, and the State Library of Oregon for their Ready to Read Summer Reading Program funds.

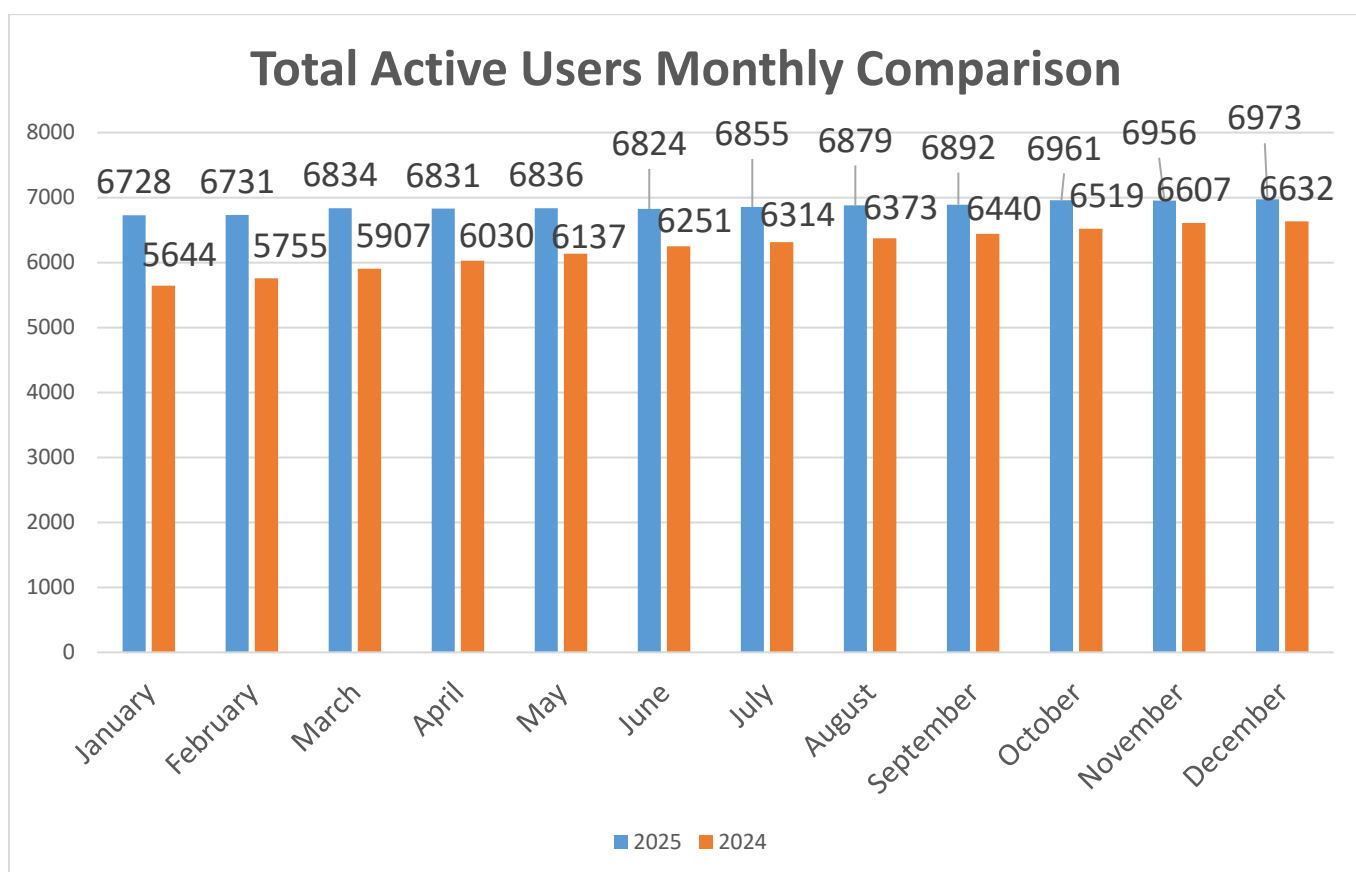
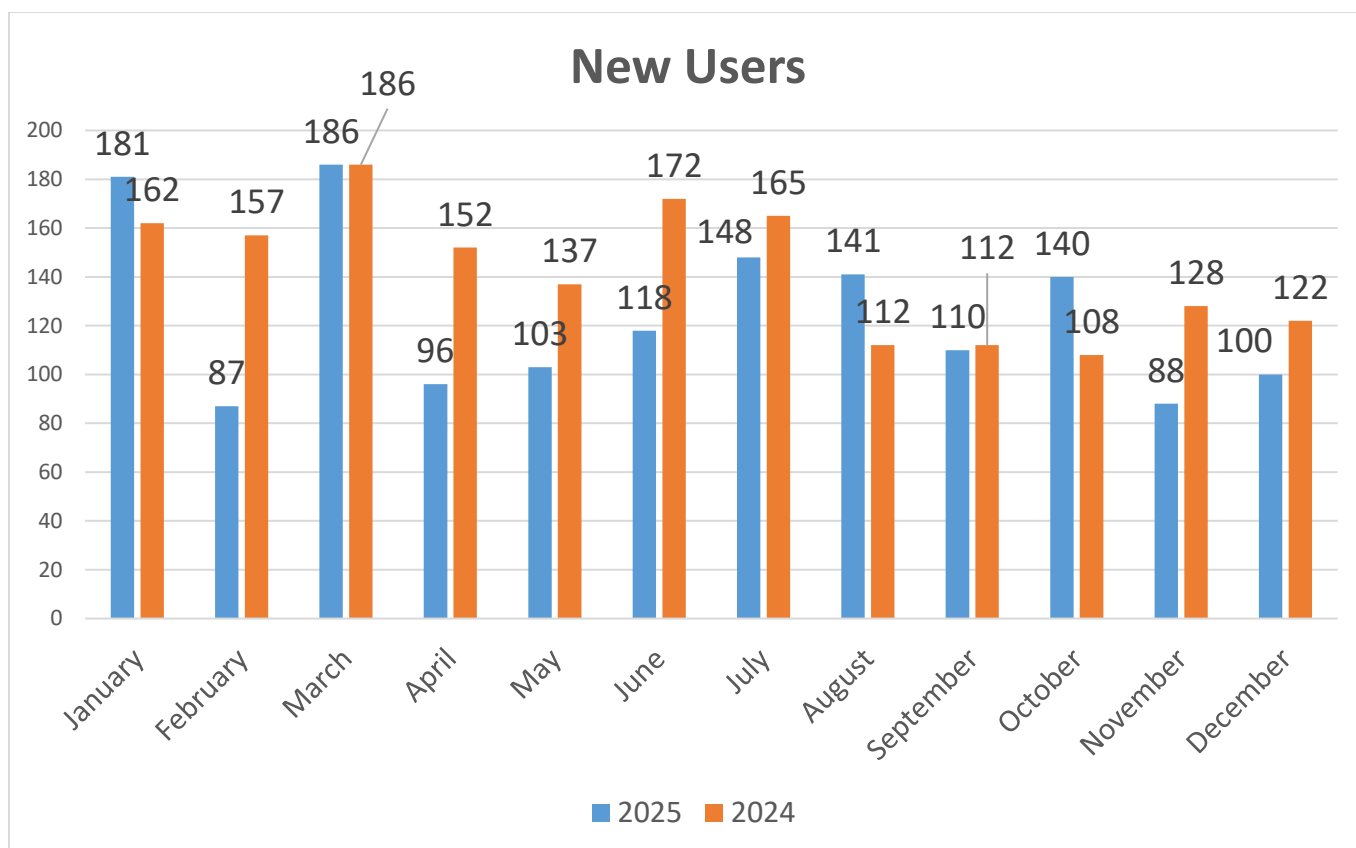
E. Facility Update

Director Wiley shared that the Friends of the Library provided the funding for the kitchenette remodel, the maintenance crew finished painting, and the project is now complete.

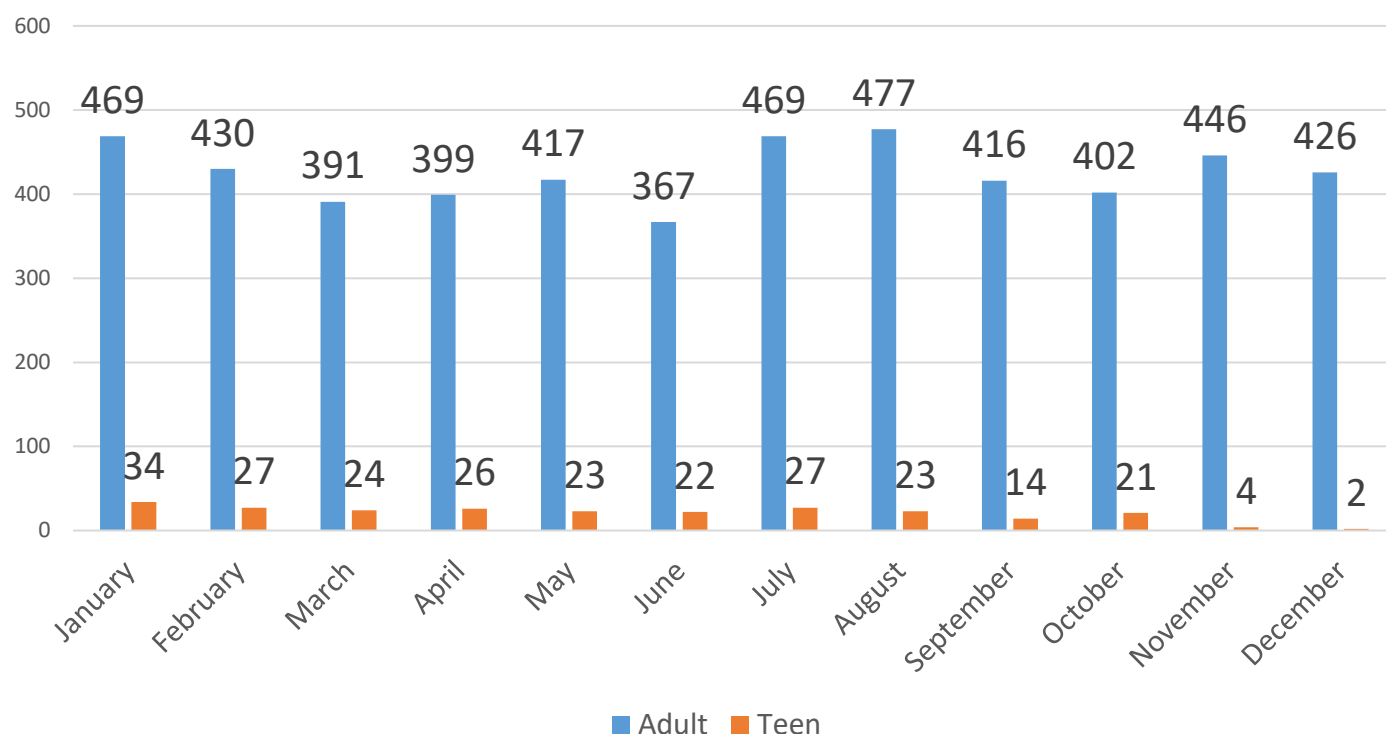
Commissioner Tassano expressed appreciation to the maintenance staff.

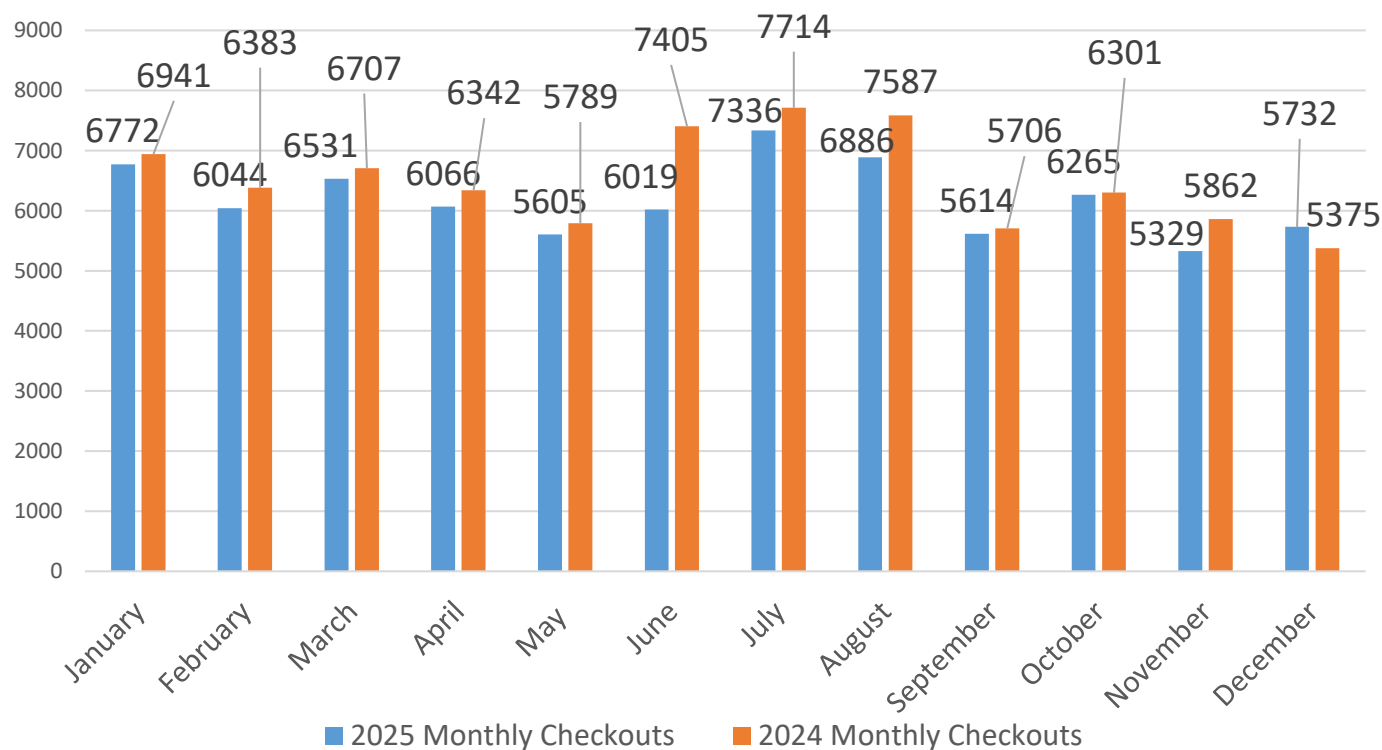

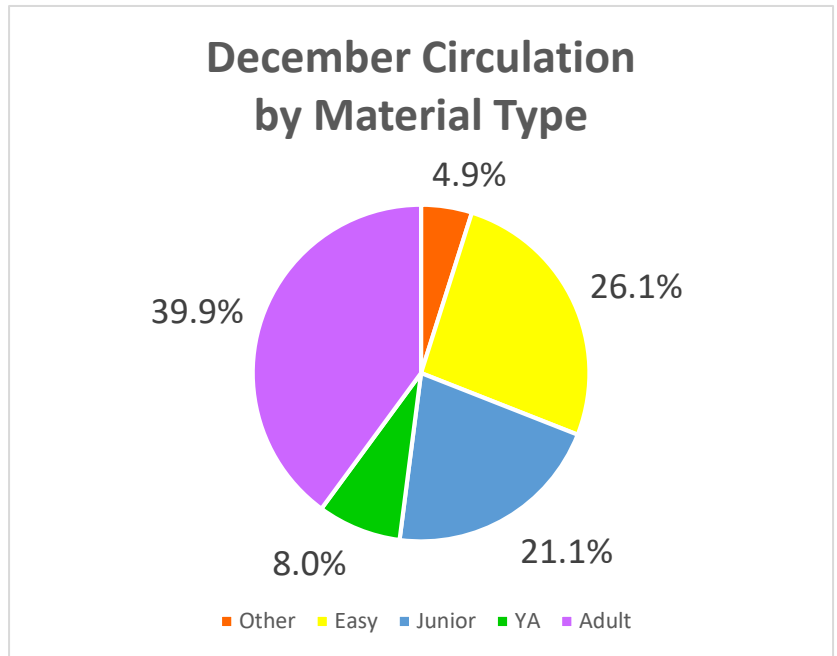
Public Computer Use

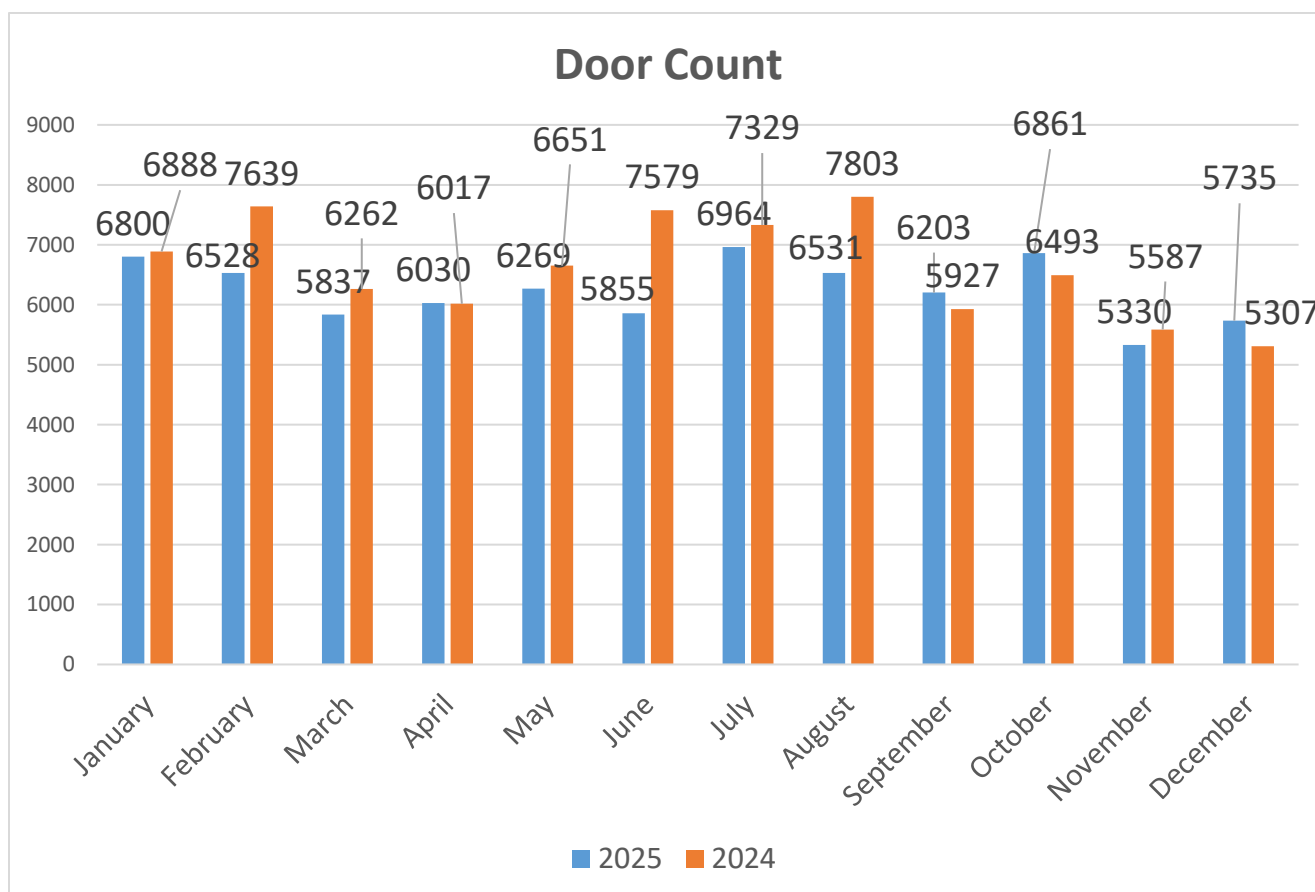

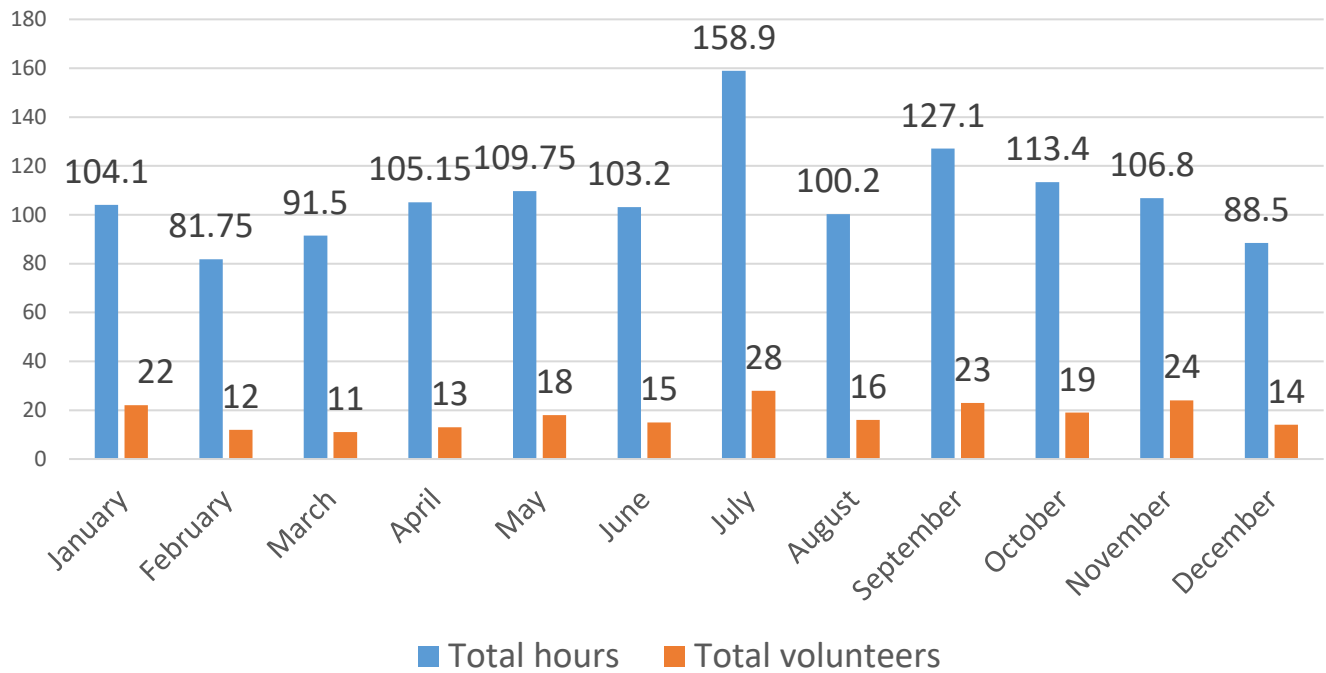

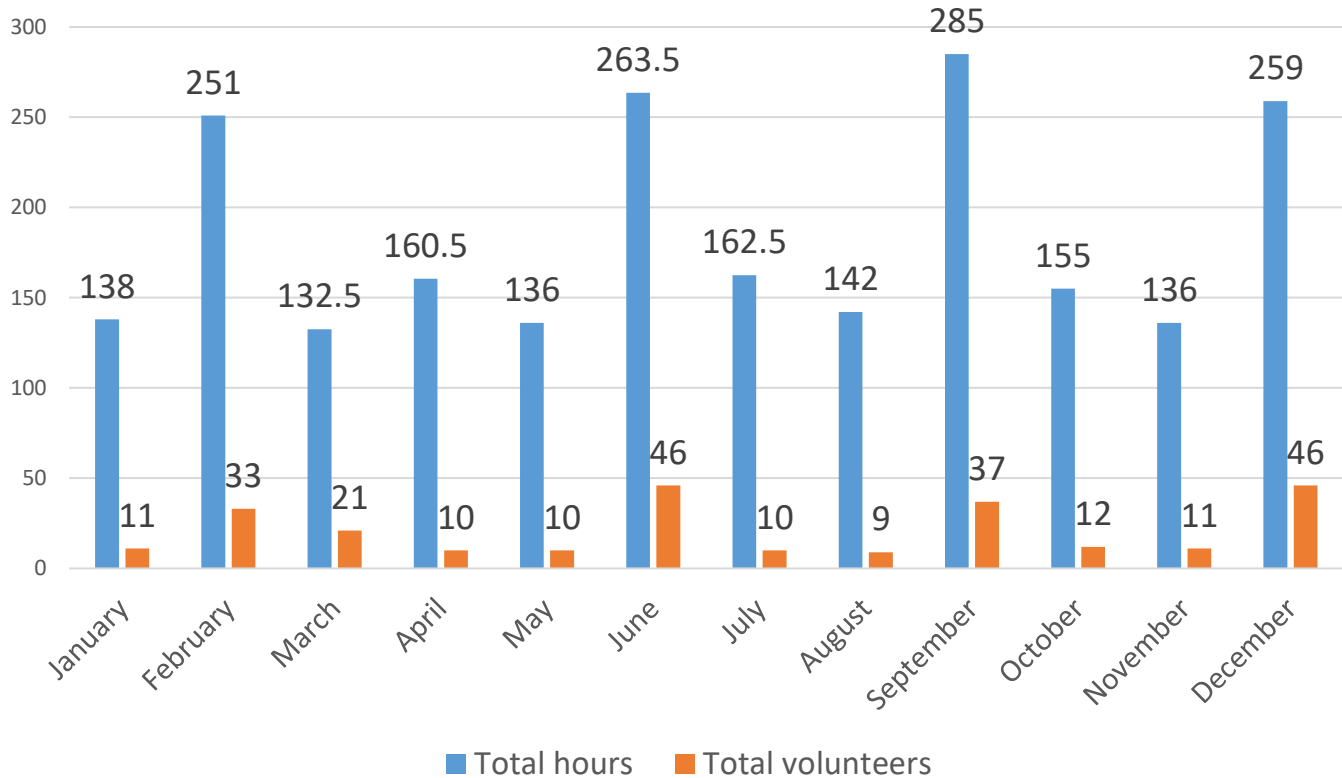

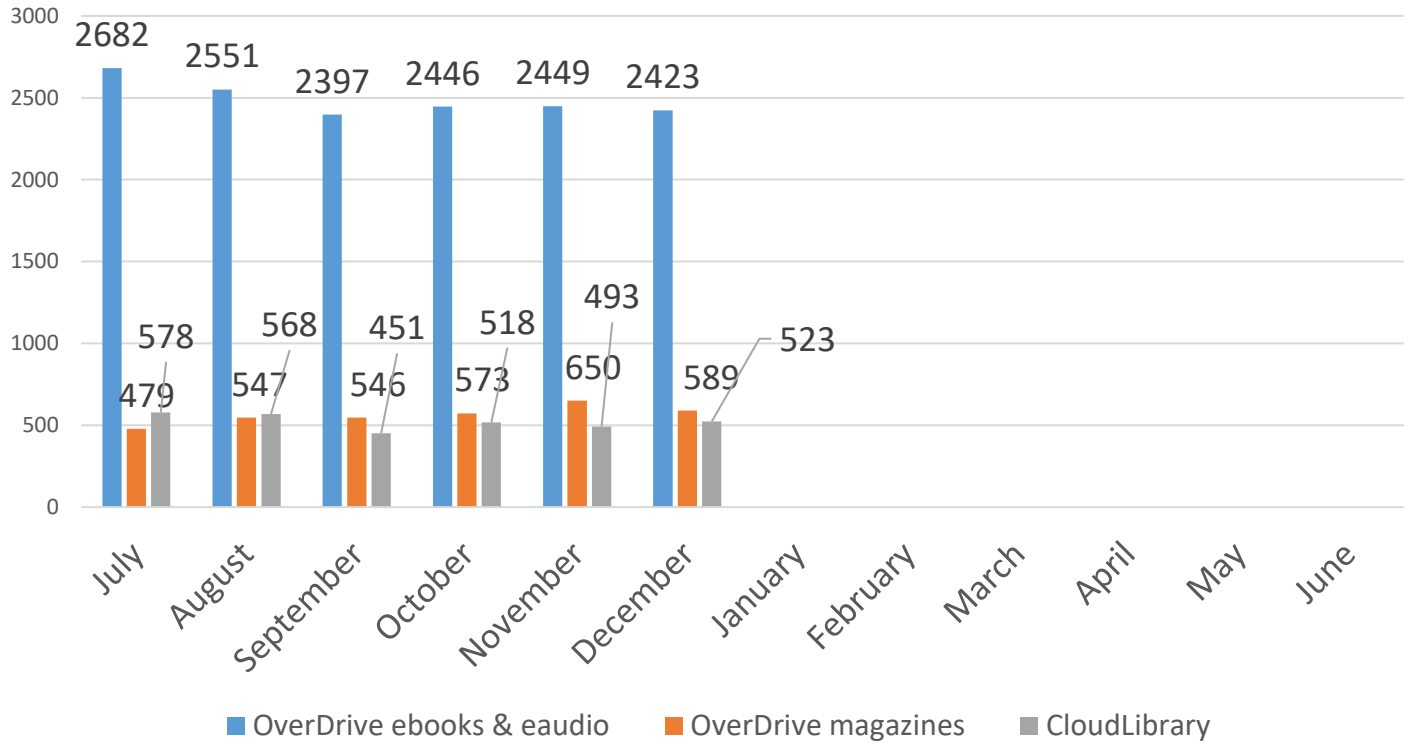
Volunteer Contribution - Library



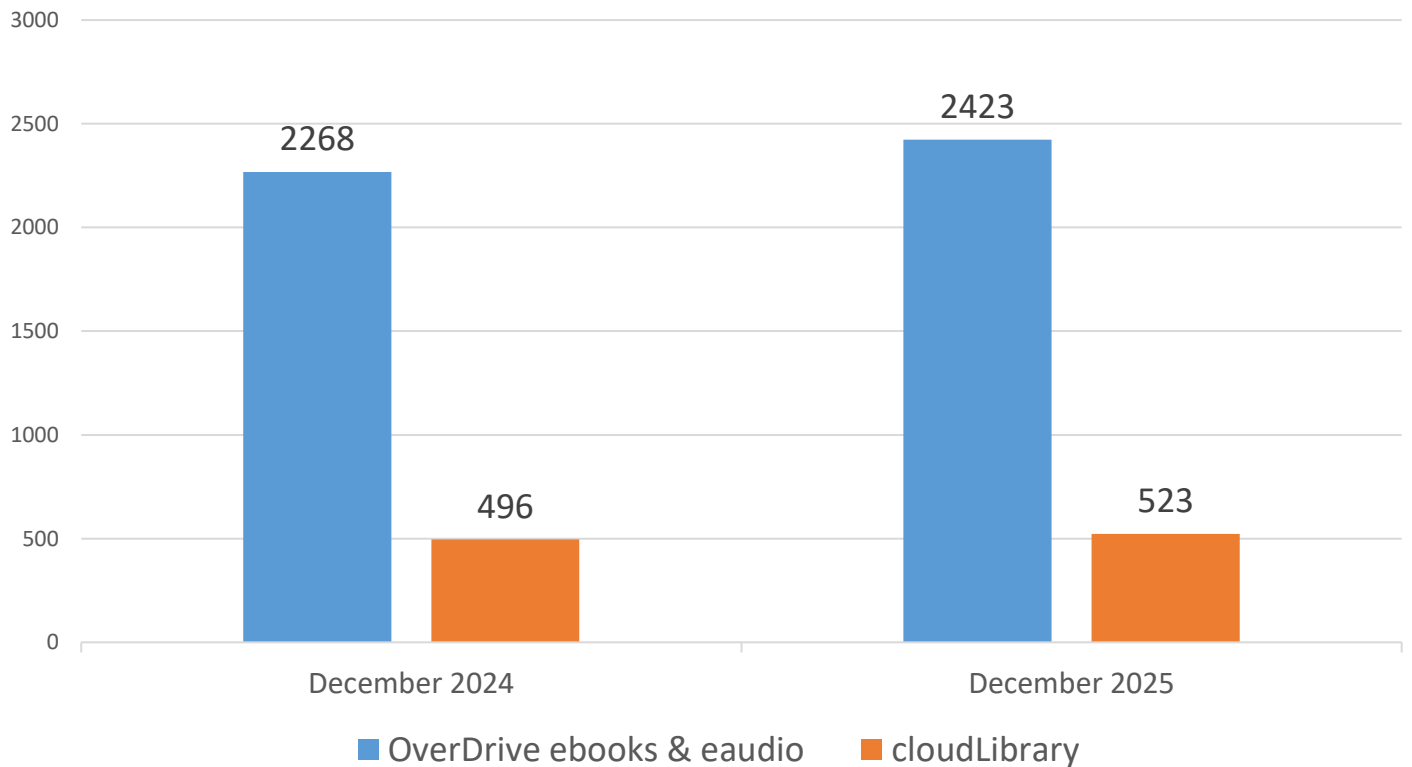

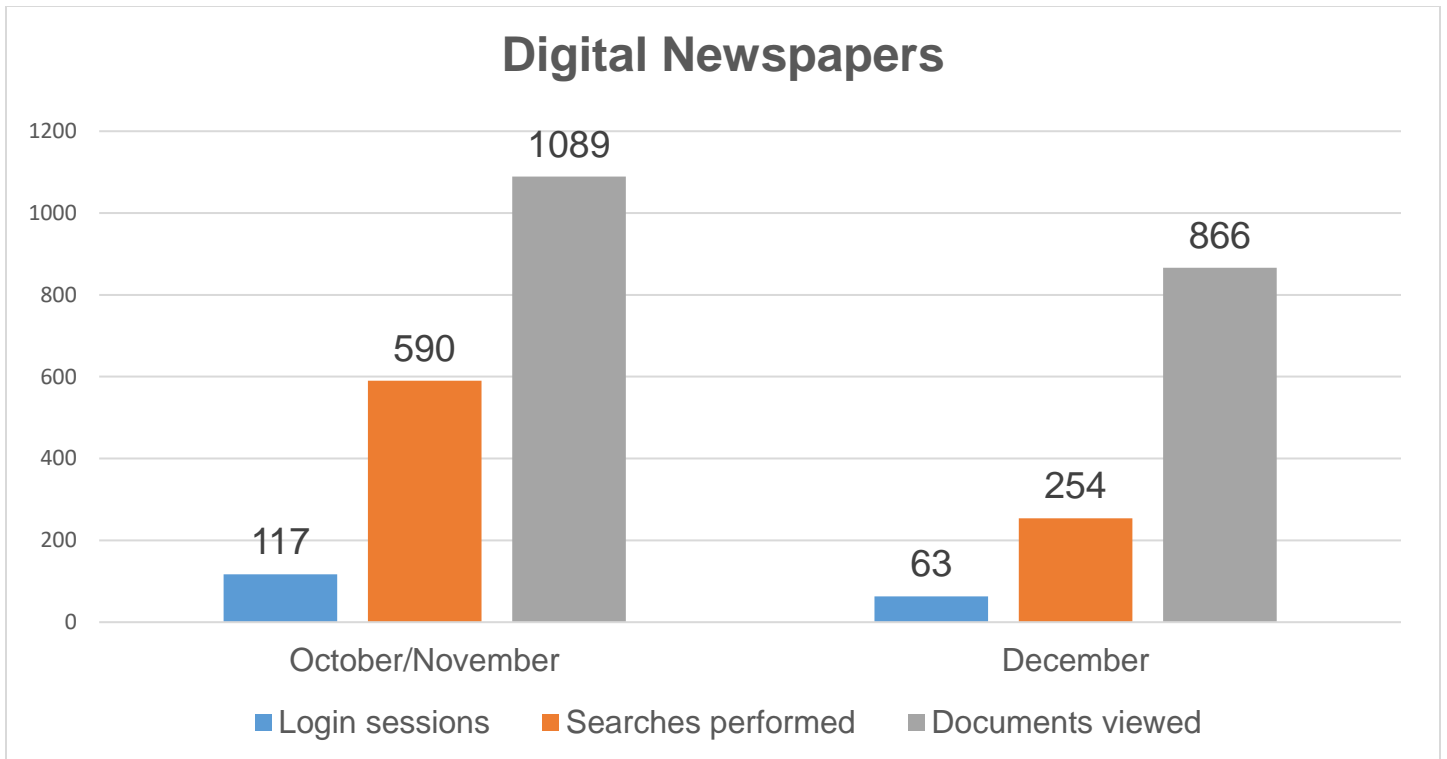


Digital Materials Checkouts

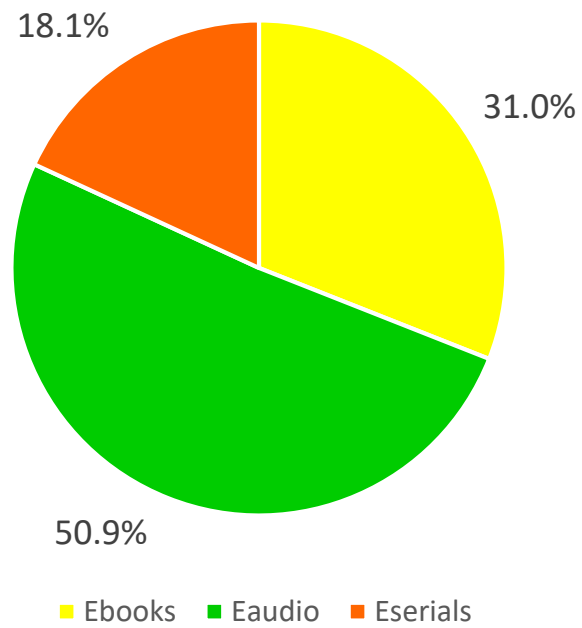


Ebooks Monthly Comparison

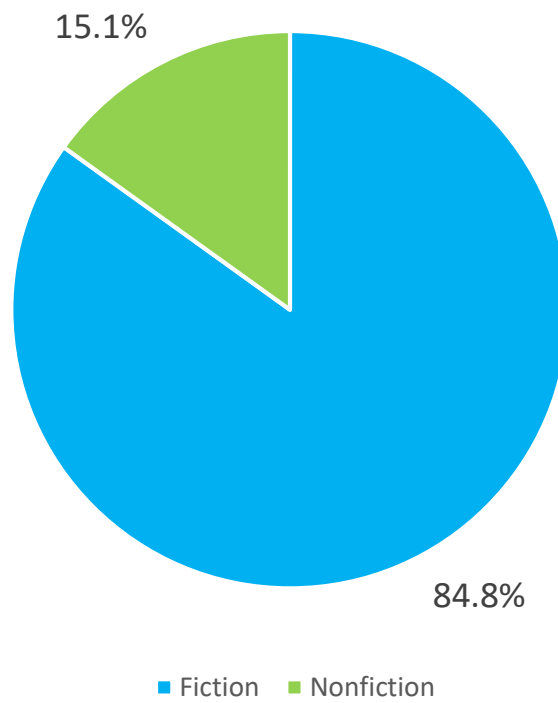




Digital Circulation by Format - December
