CITY OF ROSEBURG PARKS AND RECREATION COMMISSION SEPTEMBER 2, 2020

MINUTES

<u>CALL TO ORDER:</u> The meeting of the City of Roseburg Parks and Recreation Commission was called to order at 8:16 a.m. Wednesday, September 2, 2020, at the Large Pavilion at Stewart Park.

<u>ROLL CALL:</u> <u>Present:</u> Chair Alison Eggers, Commissioners Kyle Bailey, Diana Wales, and Bob Grubbs

<u>Attending Staff:</u> City Manager Nikki Messenger, Public Works Director Brice Perkins, Communications Specialist Eric Johnson, Parks and Recreation Program Manager Kris Ammerman, Construction and Design Manager Ryan Herinckx, and Department Technician Chanelle Rogers

Others Present:

<u>APPROVAL OF MINUTES:</u> Commissioner Wales moved to approve the minutes of the August 5, 2020 Parks and Recreation Commission meeting. Motion was seconded by Commissioner Bailey and approved with the following vote: Chair Eggers and Commissioners Bailey, Wales, and Grubbs voted yes. No one voted no.

DISCUSSION ITEMS:

Stewart Park Pavilion Renovation – Bid Award Recommendation: Ammerman reported that the City had received a grant from the Oregon Parks and Recreation Department through the Local Government Grant Program to renovate the Stewart Park Pavilion. Perkins informed the City received four bids for the project and the low bidder was DSL Builders with a bid of \$119,875.00. Chair Eggers asked where the company was from. Herinckx stated from the Eugene area. Commissioner Wales asked what all would be removed. Perkins said it includes the removal of the two existing stone fireplaces, removal and replacement of two trusses and associated roof purlins and sheeting. Additionally the existing tile roofing will be replaced with new standing seam metal roofing and there will be electrical lighting upgrades. Herinckx also mentioned there will be some skylights added to allow natural light in the pavilion. Messenger stated that 50 years is a good run for the structure and that it is time for some upgrades. Herinckx said the contractor would like to get started beginning of October and has 45 days to complete the project.

MOTION: Commissioner Grubbs moved to recommend to City Council the award of the Stewart Park Pavilion Renovation Project to the low bidder, DSL Builders for \$119,875.00. Motion was seconded by Commissioner Bailey and approved with the following vote: Chair Eggers and Commissioners Bailey, Wales, and Grubbs voted yes. No one voted no.

AUDIENCE PARTICIPATION:

INFORMATIONAL: Commissioner Wales said she is impressed with how much maintenance there is to do in the parks and how much gets accomplished with the small staff. Perkins informed the property owner on the eastern edge of Sunshine Park has built their driveway on City property. Staff has been working with that property owner to do a boundary line adjustment

and get and easement. This would allow them legal access to their property and also get City access to that edge of the park property for emergency access.

<u>BUSINESS FROM THE COMMISSION:</u> Commissioner Wales informed the swift migration is in full swing and there are still people showing up to watch but are social distancing. The swifts are going in the chimney around 8pm when the sun goes down, there were more then 2000 birds on September 1st.

ISSUE STATEMENT AND SUMMARY

The Oregon Department of Transportation has developed a new grant program for improvements to multiuse paths that improve access and safety for people walking and bicycling. Staff plans to prepare and submit a grant application to the Oregon Community Paths (OCP) program.

BACKGROUND/ANALYSIS

Staff has previously submitted the Deer Creek Trail Renovation Project to the Recreational Trails Program (RTP) administered by the Oregon Parks and Recreation Department (OPRD). The project has been unsuccessful in that grant program due to its tendency to favor projects that are more recreational than utilitarian in nature. The Deer Creek project appears to be a much better fit for the newly developed OCP program, which is dedicated to helping communities create and maintain connections through multiuse paths.

The proposed project will include the heavy restoration of approximately 1600' of the Umpqua River Trail located in Deer Creek Park within the City of Roseburg. The existing 10' wide section is raveled, cracked, and beyond its useful life. There is also an approximately 225' section with some heavy damage and undermining due to erosion. This section will get drainage upgrades to allow the water to flow away from the path to eliminate future undermining.

An aerial photograph is included to identify the location of the potential project.

FINANCIAL/RESOURCE ISSUES

Preliminary cost estimate for this project is \$175,000; with a minimum 10% match of \$17,500 coming from a combination of in-house labor and the Bike Trail Fund.

TIMING ISSUES

The Oregon Community Paths grant application must be submitted by January 31, 2021. For a resolution to be included, it must be approved by City Council no later than the January 25, 2021 meeting.

STAFF RECOMMENDATION

Staff recommends the Commission approve and forward a recommendation to City Council to support the attached Resolution and also recommend City Council authorize the City Manager to sign the grant application.

SUGGESTED MOTION

I move to recommend to City Council the authorization of the City Manager to sign the OCP grant application and adoption of the supporting Resolution.
