What is Arbor Day?

Arbor Day is a holiday that celebrates trees and nature. Its purpose is to encourage people to plant trees, and many communities take the opportunity to organize tree-planting and litter-collecting events on or around the holiday.

The first American Arbor Day was in Nebraska City, Nebraska on April 10, 1872. About one million trees were planted in the state to celebrate. By 1920, more than 45 states were also celebrating Arbor Day.

Today Arbor Day is celebrated in all 50 states. The most common date for the state observance is the last Friday in April - National Arbor Day.

Arbor Day is usually celebrated by learning about and planting trees.





Charlie's Hidden Treasure - Part 1


Hidden Treasure

My Dear Grandson Charles,


