Roseburg Public Library is a great resource for hobbyists.

The library offers lots of opportunities to explore fine and decorative arts in the middle of the 700 section of the Dewey Decimal System. From drawing to woodworking to photography, there is a book for nearly every interest.

Some of the more popular titles focus on crocheting and watercolors. "Crochet Know-How: Techniques and Tips for All Levels of Skill from Beginner to Advanced" edited by Marie Clayton and Stephen Dew and "No-Fail Watercolor: The Ultimate Beginner's Guide to Painting with Confidence" by Mako, both published in 2020, circulate regularly.

Origami and paper crafting books also generate great interest.

The library has 550 titles for adults and 400 titles for youth in this area, which begins at the number 743 and ends at 771 in the nonfiction shelves. Even more titles are available on the library's digital platforms, cloudLibrary and Libby.

We regularly review our entire collection in order to develop a popular selection that reflects the community's interests. Circulation numbers help inform purchasing, but we want to back up those statistics with input from patrons.
